

The balcony is open for those wishing to have more social distancing.

We can't calm every storm, but we can turn on the porch lights.



LUKE 2:1-20

"Recently, I was standing at The Dwelling at Richmond Hill. The former slave quarters are open and offered for visitation. After the tour, our white tour guide mentioned that Black members of the staff felt a great reverence, a holy presence at The Dwelling.

The space held the presence of God; it was like entering a sanctuary.

I remember the same feeling when I was young, touring the slave quarters at Monticello. But now, listening to the Richmond Hill staff testimony, I understood these spaces in a new way, with a reverence for the God-like presence of the Black mother in the depths of oppression."
