

The balcony is open for those wishing to have more social distancing.

WITNESS

100 YEARS OF ALLENDALE:

2024 marks Allendale's 100th Anniversary.

In 1924, Allendale United Methodist Church was established in North St. Petersburg, Florida, to serve the growing Allendale community. The founding meeting took place in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Cade Allen, where seven individuals decided to form the church, initially named "Allendale Methodist Episcopal Church."

From the start, the church was active and focused on expanding its religious programs and services for both its members and the surrounding community. The Allen family donated land for the church buildings and contributed to their financing.

Located at the intersection of 38th Avenue North, Haines Road, and 11th Street, the church buildings, including the original sanctuary (now known as the chapel), Allen Hall, and the parsonage, were constructed at a cost of \$56,372. (\$981,523 today)

Construction began in October 1925 under the supervision of Mr. Cade Allen, and the first religious service in the new Sanctuary was held on May 17, 1926, just two years after the church's founding. This rapid progress was a significant achievement for the young congregation. The first hundred members of the church were honored as "Charter Members."

While Allen Hall and the original parsonage no longer exist, the 98-year-old chapel is still here and currently serves as the worship space for Saint Teresa of Calcutta Catholic Community
