

WITNESS

IN OUR HANDS:

In the creation narrative, God shapes the world with care and creativity, infusing life into every aspect of a previously formless void. However, humanity's descent into violence and corruption brings profound sorrow to God, leading to a regret so deep that a reset through a flood seems the only solution. Yet, in Noah's family, God finds hope. This story, especially poignant as we observe Earth Day, reminds us that we hold the responsibility—handed down through God's covenant—to protect and sustain the Earth. As stewards of this planet, we are urged to safeguard it against destruction, embodying the promise of restoration and harmony symbolized by the rainbow—a vivid, encompassing sign of hope and renewal.

In this image below, God's hands hold various animals and plant life, and are surrounded by the bands of the rainbow, shielding Creation from the swirling waters of chaotic destruction. We must respond to God's covenant by protecting and keeping the earth. It is our responsibility; it is our calling. God meets us where we are—utterly dependent and bound toward self-destruction—with a promise sealed with a bow bursting with the endless spectrum of colors light holds.

PSALM 23

Many people today use Psalm 23 as a form of affirmation and creative visualization, speaking desired realities into existence, especially in times of insecurity. It is a source of comfort and reassurance, aligning us with the security we yearn for. This Psalm is often recited at funerals as a mourning prayer to transform perspectives from negative to positive, from hopeless to hopeful.

Reading the Psalms, including Psalm 23, from a different perspective reveals that the faith expressed is less about intellectual belief and more about faithful commitment as partners with God. These aren't mere affirmations but expressions of a deep, romantic endearment towards God, often mixed with lament. This heartfelt sincerity, rather than intellectual certainty, forms the foundation of such prayers, inviting us to view them through a lens that emphasizes emotional connection over doctrinal accuracy.
