Unisex/family restrooms are in the office hallway, accessible from the narthex, to the left as you exit the sanctuary.

The balcony is open for those wishing to have more social distancing.

TODAY'S THEME: *righteousness & mercy*

The crowds grumble at Jesus' self-invitation to stay with Zacchaeus, and their righteous indignation isn't without cause. As a tax collector, Zacchaeus has extorted money and acted in collusion with the empire, using his position to oppress his own people. It is important to call out oppression, and yet, Jesus offers mercy. That mercy then begets more mercy as Zacchaeus, unprompted, offers to return what he took, and then some.

WITNESS

CANDLE OF PEACE, HOPE, AND JUSTICE:

In a spirit of solidarity, more than 50 Justice-Seeking congregations around the country are lighting a candle of Peace, Hope and Justice. This candle represents Christ's light shining even in the midst of barbed wire policies that wrap tighter each day.

On this Sunday, we light the Candle of Peace, Hope, and Justice for all transgender and non-binary persons who face prejudice, violence, and discrimination in a world that too often denies their intrinsic belovedness and dignity. We pray for those who have courageously made the choice to live in truth and authenticity, knowing that their identity is a sacred gift from God.

For transgender athletes of all ages, denied the opportunity to participate in the sports they love, and which offer them joy, belonging, and purpose. For those who feel acute pain every time the letter "T" is removed from LGBTQ. For targets of misgendering, harassment, and humiliation at their workplaces and schools, in the halls of Congress, and in other public spaces by those emboldened by executive orders which narrowly define biological sex and gender. For those who live with limited access to restrooms and delayed receipt of essential federal identity documents aligned with their identity. For youth who need gender-affirming care that is now being threatened or deemed illegal.

Holy God, three-in-one, the original they/ them, may you help us remember that you are neither male nor female and that you have always left space for beautiful creation outside of binaries—for there are beaches between water and land, and there is dawn and there is dusk between day and night. God help us to embrace, love, and protect our transgender and non-binary siblings and always proclaim them as your beloved children.

We light this candle proclaiming that the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has never overcome the light. May Jesus strengthen us to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves.

"Zacchaeus" by Rev. Lauren Wright Pittman
Inspired by Luke 19:1-10

"Jesus calls Zacchaeus out of his identity as 'sycophant' [from the same root as 'sycamore'] into his new identity as 'repentant host' who invites Jesus into his home and redistributes his ill-gotten wealth. Zacchaeus's clothing holds a repeated pattern of four figs and halves of coins, referencing the fruits of his transformation.

The area where Zacchaeus sat in the tree is fruitless and dying. His actions were destructive and oppressive to his own community. The crowd is correct in grumbling about him; their anger is righteous, but Jesus offers mercy. In this visual metaphor, Jesus removes him from the tree so it has a chance to heal and nourish the whole community."
